The place of the women in the Active Life



Women in the workforce :

- Employment rate for a women : 63%
- Employment rate for a men : 79%

Women in the workforce (with a child older than 12 years old) :

- Employment rate for a women : 66%
- Employment rate for a men : 90%

Women and the part-time employment :

- 31% of working woman work in part-time
- 4 times higher than men

Wage differences between men and women :

- To earn the same salary as a man, the woman should work an average of 59 days. With 16.2% on average, the pay gap between men and women remains high. It reflects the problem of balancing work and family life experienced by women. This gap is widening in some members country.
